<u>Keeping honeybees healthy: A role for veterinarians?</u> Russ Daly, FarmForum.net, 4/21/2017. A veterinarian learns about honey bees because of the <u>Veterinary</u> <u>Feed Directive</u>. He finds that beekeepers and farmers have similar concerns and work in disease prevention.



<u>Common pesticide damages honey bees' ability to fly</u>, ScienceDaily, 4/26/2017. Biologists have provided the first evidence that a widely used pesticide -- thiamethoxam, a neonicotinoid pesticide -- can significantly impair the ability of otherwise healthy honey bees to fly.
