## **English Thyme**

\* Scientific Name: Thymus vulgaris

\* Family: Mint (Lamiaceae)

\* Attracts: Honey bees, Butterflies, Native

Notes: Leaves are highly aromatic and and are frequently used fresh or dried as a seasoning in a variety of culinary applications including soups, stews, sauces, meat and fish dishes. The plant is a natural source of thymol used in treatments to kill Varroa mites. These external parasites attack both honey bees and brood fat body tissues weakening the adult bees and spread virus within beehives. Pollen pellets are greenish-vellow.
