Lemon Balm

- * Scientific Name: Melissa officinalis
- * Family: Mint (Lamiaceae)
- * Type: Perennial Edible Herb
- * Native range: Southern Europe
- * Sun: Full sun to part shade
- * Blooms: May to September
- * Attracts: Honey bees, Bumblebees, Butterflies, & Native bees among others.
- * Cultivated: Alamance County
 Notes: Has lemon-scented foliage, that are edible and may be added to salads, soups, sauces or vegetables. The inconspicuous flowers are nectar foraged by bees. Melissa means "honey bee" in greek. The European honey bee's scientific name is Apis mellifera. "Apis" is the Latin word for "bee", "mellifera" comes from the

Greek "melli", honey, and "ferre", to bear - hence, the scientific name means the honey-bearing bee.
