Hairy Mountain Mint

- * Scientific Name: Pycnanthemum pilosum
- * Family: Mint (Lamiaceae)
- * Type: Perennial Edible Herb
- * Native range: Eastern and central United States
- * Sun: Full sun to part shade
- * Blooms: June to October
- * Attracts: Honey bees, Bumblebees, Native bees, & Wasps among others
- * Cultivated: Alamance County

Notes: The fresh minty-aromatic leaves, can be boiled in water to make an excellent mint-flavored tea. Nectar-rich flowers with pollen are very attractive to many kinds of insects, including small butterflies. Pollen pellets are white.
