Reid, Zivon and I will be telling our stories of beekeeping in 2021. It still would be a good idea to check our hives to see how many mites they have and possibly treat with Oxalic Acid. Most people use the vaporization method. I would recommend waiting until a day that the temperature is at least 65 degrees before opening up the hive to do the mite check. It's also time to put in your entrance reducers and have your IPM Boards ready to put in on cold nights. Also make sure your bees have enough food to make it through the Winter. Sugar bricks and winter patties are a good method this time of year.

Look forward to seeing you on our Zoom call !! This meeting is a good one to listen to because our speakers will be talking about what worked and what didn't work in their apiaries this year. I seem to pay more attention to the things I did that didn't work. I'm sure you will enjoy this learning experience !!

Burlington Christmas Parade Info Saturday, November 20th

This year we are again participating in the Burlington Christmas Parade!! We would love to have our members join us, come with bee suits and smokers!

PARADE ARRIVAL FOR PEOPLE WALKING OR PARTICIPATING IN THE PARADE

• NOBODY should drop off participants on Webb Avenue, please use designated drop off parking lots located throughout Downtown Burlington (City Lot off Maple #2, City Lot off Main and Front #3) on the map on the next page.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- The Burlington Christmas Parade does not assign a numbered order to the units.
- Units are lined up on a first-come/first-serve basis and are filtered into the parade line-up based on music, sizing and other factors.
- If you have registered for 2 vehicles, please plan to meet elsewhere and arrive to the staging area together. Once you are in the parade staging area, there is not an opportunity to rearrange vehicles.
- Parade Units will be lined up beginning promptly at 8:00am.
- Please be respectful of surrounding parade units- keep your music (if applicable) at a low volume and have anyone walking with your unit stay as close to your unit as possible.
- For safety reasons, no one is to throw candy or any items from their parade unit because children may run into the street and in front of cars.
 - Items may be handed directly to parade watchers by your walking units.


END OF PARADE DIRECTIONS

GENERAL & COMMERCIAL ENTRIES: Once on Kitchin Street, turn right onto Overbrook Rd. Staff will assist you in parking your vehicle/group for disassembly, then exit through round-about on Overbrook Rd. heading toward S. Church Street.

If no disassembly is required, entries may continue straight on Kitchin St. and exit via Mebane St. **PLEASE NOTE-** No units will be allowed to drive out of the parade area with people on the back of a trailer/vehicle. Everyone must have a seatbelt on inside vehicles. Units must unload **all** other participants before exiting the area.

PARTICIPANT PICK-UP

- If you are picking up someone who is participating in the parade, please make plans to park at the Maynard Aquatics Center and walk to meet your group on Overbrook surrounding the ballfields.
 - The Aquatics Center area is ONLY ACCESSIBLE via S. Church St (near the Park Restaurant)
 - A few other options for pick-up within a short walking distance are the Kernodle Senior Center parking lot (Mebane St), and the Homebuilders Parking Lot (Overbrook via S Church).
- Please stay on sidewalks/grass areas and out of the road as much as possible. There will be parade traffic exiting through the roundabout.



This month in the bee yard...

Combine hives that are weak/have failing queens.

Ensure adequate ventilation near top of hive.

Feed thick syrup, candy boards or fondant if needed, for winter stores.

Provide weights (brick, rock, concrete block, etc.) for tops of hives to limit wind-induced toplessness.

Plant trees for future nectar/pollen sources (tulip poplar, maple, sourwood, etc.).

Consider closing off screened bottom board to improve heat insulation.
